

## **Poster Presentation Guidelines**

Follow these general guidelines to enhance in-person viewing of your poster and in the virtual format on our AMSN Convention mobile app and website:



You can expect the Poster Hall to have standard poster boards which are 4' x 8' and are double-sided. Please take into consideration the amount of usable space to ensure your poster fits appropriately on the board.

## **Poster Format Recommendations**

- Include (a) learning objective(s) in easily readable font on the poster.
- $_{\odot}$   $\,$  Include the poster title and author(s) clearly at the top of the poster.
- Individual sections (such as the background, methods, results, and conclusions) should be easy to locate on the poster.
- Individual sections should be easy to read and concise. Avoid large blocks of text and long sentences.
- There should be enough contrast between the color of the text and the poster's background to enable easy viewing.



## **Poster Content Guidelines**

- $_{\odot}$   $\,$  The references cited should be from the last five to seven years.
- Poster authors must have written permission to use copyrighted materials, including graphics.
- Define the use of all abbreviations clearly upon first use.
- Include all relevant data outcomes, pre- and post-intervention, etc. as applicable.
- No commercial support can be displayed on the poster itself.
  Product photos can be used as long as the manufacturer's name cannot be seen in/on the photo or if the product is the only one for its use on the market.
- No company or product names can be used within the text on the poster. No actual products can be displayed near the poster. Names of hospital/organization are accepted.

If non-compliance is found, the poster may be removed and NCPD will not be awarded.

## Additional Considerations for PDF Version of Poster

- All text and illustrations should be easy to read when opened on a single computer monitor with minimal "zooming in" required, if possible.
- Posters should be prepared on one sheet and saved as a PDF.
- A good option is to create the poster in PowerPoint, then save it as a PDF.
- Landscape format is preferred for optimal viewing on a computer screen.
